Regional Reports

Philippines

The Cebu Sector after great difficulties due to the pandemic and typhoons is now going through a phase of stabilisation and has resumed usual activities. Following the Annual Charter Mass in September 2022, a schedule of activities was undertaken in the remainder of 2022, including a Formation and Information Day in November, Advent Recollection, & Christmas party with all the families in December. The involvement of the Piarist priests from their local parish as spiritual counsellors has re-commenced after two years.

On 30 October a Commissioning Ceremony for the new Sector Couple, Elma and Frederick Tan, was held over Zoom. Elma and Frederick had attended a Templestowe Formation weekend in 2019 and have been Team members since the founding of Cebu Teams in 2000. This event also provided the opportunity for members from Oceania, on behalf of the International Teams Movement, to thank all previous Sector Couples, including 4 Sector Couples who could be present during the ceremony.

The Cebu Sector considers it highly beneficial and important to continue to streamline e-communication to maintain relationships with Teams across the Oceania Region. The participation of Cebu Team members in the 2021 virtual Oceania Gathering attests to this, as was their virtual involvement in the 2022 Templestowe Formation Gathering and virtual Eurasia Zone - and regular liaison meetings.

Aotearoa/New Zealand

NSW/ACT

Gary and Lois, current ACT Sector couple, have been greatly involved in Teams' life over many years, working very hard and presenting most recently at our ACT Sector Formation just a weekend before. Much has been happening in our Region, and the feedback was great from the couples who attended the Templestowe Formation Retreat in Sept 2022, including Joceline and Ghassan from Sydney. The NSW and ACT newsletter was sent out in October. In Sydney a 'Crossroads' event was held in November with the topic being 'Live, Laugh, Love" and there is a Crossroads planned for Canberra in 2023.



In Sydney we have two new teams formed from 'St John the Beloved' Maronite Parish. Discussion is also underway with couples to form another new team from St Charbel's Punchbowl in 2023. Sydney Teams families hosted a very productive Oceania Team meeting, held in our home in November. Vic West

We have been active in our Region and in various Oceania working groups such as communications, and website. In June we collated & submitted a response to Pope Francis' Synod in Rome on behalf of Oceania. A Teams West Newsletter was distributed in September, and the decision was made to exclude flood affected Teams from subs in 2022. These floods in Victoria interrupted the plan to hold

Regional gatherings in NE Vic, with teams in Echuca, Mooroopna and Shepparton being impacted. The North East gathering is now anticipated to be held in March 23, and will be led in part by the Monas and Murrays, both couples having attended the August 2022 Templestowe Retreat and Formation weekend. We were saddened to learn of the recent passing of Laurence Mona's sister in PNG, may she RIP.

We are working towards growth in our immediate region with upcoming opportunities to be offered in 2023. We shared information and promoted the <u>Marriage Master Class initiative</u>, along with strategies for growth of Teams in our region discussed at Templestowe.

It was pleasing to be able to meet Vic East members in August at Templestowe and discuss the future of Teams in Victoria. We know efforts continue in Vic East to navigate a path to establishing a different kind of leadership model that nonetheless works for Vic East and the wider Teams movement.

This year saw sad news with the death of two Team members: Pat Goggin and from Team 3 in Bendigo, Gay Hanrahan, both much missed. A short, but important inclusion here regarding Pat; Pat is survived by his wife Marguerita and together they were the first Super Regional Couple for Australasia/Oceania from 1997-2001. They also chaired an Australian based Satellite Team, supporting Movement work on the topic of Mission. They made a huge contribution to the work of Teams and generously supported Teams financially at a time of need.

Eurasia Zone Report

A highlight in recent times has been celebrating the 75th anniversary of the Teams Charter. The meeting of the International Leading Team (ERI) in Paris last December coincided with the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The date 8 December 2022 held special significance in the history of the movement as it was 75 years since the Teams Charter was promulgated by Fr Caffarel.

To celebrate this milestone, Mass was arranged by the Teams in France at St Augustin's Church in Paris. This is where Fr Caffarel first proclaimed the Charter in 1947. It was a very moving experience for us to be in this same place 75 years later, reflecting on the legacy of Fr Caffarel. We remain very grateful for the charism we have received through Fr Caffarel, expressed in the Charter.

At a talk given in Brazil in 1962, Fr Caffarel gave some important insights into the development of the Charter:

".... The first part of the Charter ... define[s] the raison d'être, the purpose, the aim of Teams [the 'why']. The other parts of the document define the means to reach this aim [the 'how']. What is original in our Charter is the means adopted to achieve the purpose Without it, we could have all the rest, the means could be known, but the means would not guide or orient."

More on the International Teams Movement....

Following this reflection from Kevin and Faye, we suggest a visit to the <u>Teams</u> <u>International website</u>. Here, among other interesting items, you can read recent letters to Teams members from a number of the International Leading Team, including the complete version of Spiritual Counsellor Ricardo Londoño Domínguez's letter, from which the below is extracted.

"... Francis, the successor of John XXIII, has endeavoured to make the Second Vatican Council visible and active. He wants the baptised to become more and more aware of what we are and what we are called to be. In a permanent process of discernment, he wants the whole Church to assume its mission of being a sign and an instrument, and to go out to bear witness to God's love, rather than being inward-looking.

As Teams of Our Lady, members of the Church, we must recognise ourselves, in a special way, in the every-day invitations and calls to be signs and instruments of unity in the midst of a fractured and divided world.

The unity of Christian spouses, born through the sacraments of baptism and marriage, must be the beginning of this path of unification. Each Team, in its role as a small community, must live the mystery of unity in Christ to become a sign and instrument of intimate union with God and humankind. The Movement as a whole must reflect this same reality.

Hence, our reality must be framed within the context of what the whole Church is called to be, to signify and to reflect. May the Holy Spirit, source of unity and holiness, walk with us in this purpose."

Teams International Intercessors

We share this short excerpt from the latest newsletter from the Teams' Intercessors network. It references the very important occasion that was 8 December 2022 and is a lovely sharing of the kind of spirit that motivates and animates the global group of intercessors.

[Last] year on the feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8, Teams of Our Lady celebrated the 75th Anniversary of the founding Charter of the Teams' movement. A very beautiful ceremony took place in Paris, in the presence of Father P.D. Marcovits and the International Leading Team. The 24 hours of Intercession throughout the world supported this event in and through prayer. The Intercessors united to entrust to Mary all the prayer intentions that they carry in their hearts. Deo gratias!
