Pope Francis shares some personal reflections on this great saint who was a lowly carpenter living in the tiny and obscure village of Nazareth in Galilee. He writes about St Joseph as:


- A beloved father

Announcing a year dedicated to St Joseph, the Holy Father presents St Joseph as an example of the type of father so sorely needed in the world and in the Church today.
